ORDINANCE 1994-4

THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE IS BEING ADOPTED ON 11\14\94 IN ORDER TO ESTABLISH GUIDELINES REGARDING TAP ON FEES TO BE CHARGED TO THOSE PERSONS LIVING OUTSIDE THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF WESTPORT AND WISHING TO TAP ON TO THE MUNICIPAL WATER LINES.

1. The normal tap on fee will be One thousand dollars (\$1,000.) with the following exceptions.

- A. Where the property in question adjoins the main line coming into town from the reservoir, the normal in town tap on fee will be charged. Property directly across the road from the main line will be considered on the line.

If there is an existing line which crosses the road to access other users the town reserves the right to tap this line as a matter of convenience.

This does not alter the definition of previously described property in item "A" as being considered on the main line.

- B. Where the Westport Water Company already has a line extended outside of town limits and this is not the "main line" previously described the Westport Water Co. may allow tap on for the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

- C. In some cases a request may be made by residents living outside of the corporate limits to extend water

service to their homes when it is not economically feasible to do so.

In these cases they may be required to contribute more than the One thousand dollars (\$1,000) to the water line extension project.

In these cases any tap on to the extended portion beyond where a previous line existed will be charged a tap on fee which will require them to share the cost equally with those who have made the initial investment including the Westport Water Co.


The exact terms of this sharing should be spelled out in the agreement.

These agreements will normally run for five years at which time the tap on fee for additional users will revert to the normal one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

These are meant as general guidelines and the Westport Town Council reserves the right to deviate from them in unusual circumstances in order to protect the rights and investment of the residents of Westport in their water company.
